# RULES OF THE WROCLAW SIMULATION STUDENT COMPETITION 28.03.2020

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS

§1

- 1. The organizer of the Student Simulation Competition is the Medical University of Wrocław through the Department of Medical Simulation at the Medical University of Wrocław, located in Wrocław at ul. Chałubińskiego 7a, hereinafter referred to as the Organizer.
- 2. Student Simulation Competitions, hereinafter referred to as Competitions, will be held on 28th of March 2020 at the Organizer's office at ul. Chałubińskiego 7a in Wrocław as part of the project entitled "Teaching development at the Medical Simulation Centre in Wrocław", co-financed from the European Social Fund.

## TERMS OF PARTICIPATION

§2

- 1. The Competition may be attended by one or multidisciplinary teams composed solely of students of the Wroclaw Medical University.
- 2. The team can consist of maximum: 5 people. Student participant in the competition can only be part of one team.
- 3. The list of qualified teams to participate in the Competition will be published at <a href="http://www.csm.umed.wroc.pl/iii-studenckie-zawody-symulacyjne/">http://www.csm.umed.wroc.pl/iii-studenckie-zawody-symulacyjne/</a>
- 4. Each team will receive a starting number drawn before the start of the Competition.
- 5. Each team member must wear medical clothing and a T-shirt received from the Organizer, which he/she will receive during registration.
- 6. Participants are required to carry an identifier received from the Organizer.
- 7. Participation in the competition is free.

- 1. The Competition relies on tasks of practical-based medical simulation.
- 2. The Competition will assess knowledge, technical and non-technical skills, such as threat prediction, decision making, task performance, teamwork and communication.
- 3. The Ground Jury has the right to ask questions to any team member.
- 4. The competition consists of two parts: the qualifying round and the final round.
- 5. In the qualifying round, each team will have to present under two tasks medical treatment in simulated conditions.
- 6. The four teams that scored the most points in the qualifying round qualify for the final. In a situation where more than one team will take the fourth place achieving the same number of points in the qualifying round, the Organizer reserves the right to conduct a medical knowledge test for all Competition teams that have obtained the same number of points.
- 7. Four tasks will be carried out in the final round.
- 8. The content of the task will be given to the team in written form before the task starts.
- 9. The simulation time is limited to 15 minutes per task.
- 10. The time is started by the judge of the task with the words "Attention, start time". The task ends with the words of the judge: "Thank you, end of task".
- 11. After the time allocated for the task has expired, the team is obliged to leave the place of execution of the task immediately after the referee's instructions.
- 12. If before the expiry of the allotted time, the team decides that they have completed all the tasks that should have been carried out in a given case, they may complete the task at any time at their own request.
- 13. While performing tasks, teams are prohibited from using means of communication in the form of telephones, radio stations, pagers, walkie-talkies and any other communication devices (excluding those used to perform the task provided by the Organizer). Using the above means of communication and other attempts to obtain or provide information on the tasks of the Competition will disqualify the entire team.

- 14. In the area of task performance, during its implementation there can only be people authorized by the Organizer (team, judges, technicians, representatives of the Organizer, media or other persons having the consent of the Organizer).
- 15. Members of teams that are not performing a given task at the place of competition are allowed to stay.
- 16. Between tasks, teams will wait in an isolated room under the care of the Organiser's representatives and will have a separate toilet at their disposal. Unauthorized abandonment of the abovementioned room by a team member will result in the team being disqualified.
- 17. Teams will be brought to tasks by the team's supervisors appointed by the Organizer.
- 18. Teams may only use medical equipment provided by the Organizer, excluding stethoscopes, which they should have.
- 19. During the tasks at the Medical Simulation Centre, a simulation technician or judge may interrupt the task and exclude the team from competition if the team's behavior violates safety rules or may damage equipment owned by the Wroclaw Medical University.
- 20. Judges' decisions during the Competition are final and not subject to discussion. Teams are required to follow the instructions of judges and simulation technicians when carrying out tasks.
- 21. Any disputable situations are resolved by the Head Referee appointed by the Organizer from the competition judging team.

### **PUNCTATION**

# §4

- 1. Task scoring will be based on assessment tables. Each judge assesses the team by completing a score card with points.
- 2. After the team completes the task, the judges return the assessment cards to the Organizer's representative, who averages the number of points scored by the team in the given task. The sum of the average results of the tasks in both final round is the result obtained by the team in the Competition.
- 3. In the case of two or more teams obtaining the same number, the order of the teams will be determined by the points obtained in the qualifying round.
- 4. The organizer allows the situation to classify these teams ex aequo in the same place.

#### FINAL REGULATIONS

§5

- 1. Each participant in the Competition accepting these regulations agrees to the registration and dissemination of their image in the video monitoring system of the Medical Simulation Centre for the purposes of the University's Competition or promotional materials.
- 2. The organizer, as well as persons related to the conduct and organization of the Competition, shall not be liable to participants for personal, material or material damage that occurs before, during or after the Competition.
- 3. The team that is responsible for the destruction of the equipment used during the competition is the one that, while performing tasks under the Competition, violated the rules set out in the regulations and did not comply with the instructions of the competition judges and the Organizer.
- 4. Serious breach of security rules and regulations during the Competition will be punished by excluding the team from further competition. This decision is made by the Organizer in consultation with the Main Referee.
- 5. It is forbidden to drink alcohol, use narcotic drugs or smoke during the competition. Competition participants who appear to be drunk and under the influence of drugs will be disqualified from further participation in the Competition and the University Authorities will be notified of the event.
- 6. Before entering the competition, the Participant will agree in writing to the processing of his image in the video monitoring system and consent to the processing of his personal data by the UMW.
- 7. The condition of participation in the Competition is to complete the registration form on an hourly basis. 12.00 on 15.01.2020
- 8. The organizer does not cover the costs related to travel, accommodation and insurance of competition participants.
- 9. The organizer reserves the right to cancel the Competition for reasons beyond his control.
