

# INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS' CHAMPIONSHIPS IN TRAUMA MANAGEMENT SIMULATION - WROCLAW 3-5.07.2020

## GENERAL CONDITIONS

### §1

1. The organizer of the International Students' Championships in Trauma Management Simulation is the Department of Medical Simulation of Wroclaw Medical University, located in Wrocław at ul. Tytusa Chałubińskiego 7a, hereinafter referred to as the Organizer.
2. The International Students' Championships in Trauma Management Simulation, hereinafter referred to as the Championships, will be held on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> of July 2020 at the Organizer's venue Centrum Symulacji Medycznej at ul. Tytusa Chałubińskiego 7a in Wrocław.

## TERMS OF PARTICIPATION

### §2

1. The Championships may be attended by one or multidisciplinary teams composed solely of students.
2. Each team may consist of 4 or 5 people. Student - participant in the competition can only be part of one team.
3. The list of qualified teams to participate in the Championships will be published at <http://www.csm.umed.wroc.pl/300-2/>.
4. Each team will receive a starting number drawn before the start of the Championships.
5. Each team member must wear scrubs and a T-shirt received from the Organizer, which he/she will receive during registration.
6. Participants are required to carry an ID-badge received from the Organizer.
7. There is no entry fee for the competition.

## COMPETITION PROCEDURE

### §3

1. The Championships rely on tasks of practical-based medical simulation.
2. The Championships will be performed entirely in English.
3. The Championships will assess knowledge, technical and non-technical skills, such as situation awareness, decision making, task performance, teamwork and communication.
4. The Grand Jury has the right to ask questions of any team member during the Championships.
5. The Championships consists of two parts: a qualifying round and the final round.
6. In the qualifying round, each team will have to participate in 6 tasks.
7. The four teams that scored the most points in the qualifying round will go on to the final. In the event of a tie in the qualifying round, the Organizer reserves the right to conduct an

extra task for teams that have obtained the same number of points in order to identify the four teams that will progress to the final.

8. Two tasks will be carried out in the final round.
9. The content of the task as well as the time limitation will be given to the team in written form before the task starts.
10. Each task will commence when the referee says "Attention, time starts". The task ends with the words: "Thank you, end of task".
11. After the time allocated for the task has expired, the team must leave the performance area immediately after the referee's instructions.
12. If before the expiry of the allotted time, the team decides that they have completed all the procedures that should have been carried out in a given case, they may complete the task at any time at their own request.
13. While performing tasks, teams may not use any means of communication in the form of telephones, radio stations, pagers, walkie-talkies and any other communication devices (excluding those used to perform the task provided by the Organizer). Using or attempting to use any of these means of communication or other attempts to obtain information on the tasks of the Championships by any member of a team will disqualify the entire team.
14. During a task, only those people authorised by the Organizer may be in the performance area. These will consist of the team performing the task, judges, technicians, representatives of the Organizer, media or other persons having the consent of the Organizer.
15. In the event that only part of the team is required to perform a given task the rest team members are allowed to stay and observe, but they may not help or interfere in any way with the performance of the task. If they do so the team will be disqualified.
16. In the time between tasks, teams will wait in an isolated room under the care of the Organizer's representatives and will have a separate toilet at their disposal. Any team member who leaves the isolation room without the permission of the Organizer's representative will be disqualified together with his/her team.
17. Teams will be brought to tasks by the team's supervisor appointed by the Organizer.
18. Teams may only use medical equipment provided by the Organizer, excluding stethoscopes, which they should have.
19. During the tasks at the Medical Simulation Centre, a simulation technician or judge may interrupt the task and exclude the team from Championships if the team's behaviour violates safety rules or risks damaging equipment owned by the Wroclaw Medical University.
20. The judges' decisions during the Championships are final and not subject to discussion. Teams are required to follow the instructions of judges and technical staff when carrying out tasks.
21. Any disputable situations will be resolved by the Head Referee appointed by the Organizer from the Championships judging team.

## SCORING

### §4

1. Task scoring will be based on assessment tables. Each judge assesses the team by completing a score card with points.
2. After the team completes the task, the judges return the assessment cards to the Organizer's representative, who calculates the average number of points scored by the team in the given task. The sum of the average results of both tasks in the final round is the result obtained by the team in the Championships.
3. In the case of two or more teams obtaining the same amount of points, the order of the teams will be determined by the points obtained in the qualifying round.
4. If the sum of the points obtained in both qualifying and final rounds is still equal, these teams will be classified as *ex aequo*.

## FINAL REGULATIONS

### §5

1. Each participant in the Championships accepting these regulations agrees to the registration and dissemination of their image in the video monitoring system of the Medical Simulation Centre for the purposes of the Championships or promotional materials.
2. Before entering the Championships, the Participant will agree in writing to the recording of his/her images and their use for educational and promotional purposes, as well as consent to the processing of his/her personal data by the Organizer.
3. The organizer, as well as persons related to the conduct and organization of the Championships, shall not be liable for personal, or material damage that occurs before, during or after the Championships.
4. Any team responsible for damage of equipment due to improper or careless use, as stated in the regulations and confirmed by the referees, while performing tasks will be withdrawn from the competition
5. Serious breach of security rules and regulations during the Championships will be punished by excluding the team from further competition. This decision is made by the Organizer in consultation with the referees.
6. It is forbidden to drink alcohol, use narcotic drugs or smoke in the Championships' venue. Championships' participants who appear to be drunk and/or under the influence of drugs will result in disqualification of the respective team from the Championships and their tutor will be notified of the event.
7. The condition of participation in the Championships is to complete the registration form by 20.04.2020.
8. The Organizer will not be responsible for the costs related to travel and insurance of Championships' participants.
9. The Organizer reserves the right to cancel the Championships if reasons beyond his control make them untenable.
